MUSEUM LIBRARY AND ARCHIVE

The first museum of Kurdish heritage in the world, its collection consists of more than 500 items of Kurdish handiwork with some artifacts up to 100 years old.

The museum is a major cultural resource for school children in Hammersmith & Fulham and for academics and researchers across the UK.

The museum is run by volunteers of the Western Kurdistan Association. Established in 1997 as a Kurdish community for refugees, the association also provides the following services:

- Advice and information for Kurdish refugees on employment, welfare, housing, health and immigration (every year we serve more than 2,000 refugees).
- Kurdish, English and computer courses.
- Film making for young people, producing short films in Kurdish with English subtitles.
- Football club with training and tournaments.
- Radio broadcasting.
- Plus many other activities related to the community, such as social events and cultural seminars and lectures.
